



Chinese pottery, like <u>Dish with birds</u> and flowering peony (left), was popular all over the world, from Iran to Holland. We can tell that this <u>Dish with two</u> cranes (right) was inspired by Chinese pottery, but was made in Iran because they used a different kind of clay that is more porous (which means that it has more holes in it that air can escape from). This made the dish more fragile, which explains its cracks.



The potbelly signals his love for sweets and his curved trunk embodies "Aum," the sound-symbol of the universe.
